






# LOCAL AUTHORS @ THE LIBRARY

The pandemic blew up every plan Sam ever had post-college, and now she's stuck living with her mom, working a

deadbeat job. Her sad status quo is disrupted when Nick

moves in next door with his young daughter. As Sam confronts her relationship with her father, she starts a relationship with Nick. This romance hits on the ways the

pandemic affected everyone's lives.

Medusa—legend, myth, monster—was once an innocent girl named Meddy who longed to see the world beyond her island. Meddy is a mortal born of two immortal sea gods in Poseidon's kingdom. When she catches the attention of the goddess Athena and is taken on as an acolyte in her temple, she thinks she has found her purpose, but a misstep angers the Gods and she becomes Medusa. A feminist tale that will capture readers' attention from the first page.



(Tiny Reparations Books)






Cursed Daughters: A Novel Oyinkan Braithwaite (Doubleday Books)




The Forget-Me-Not Library Heather Webber (St. Martin's Press)


