





Winterland By Rae Meadows


A young gymnast in the gold-winning 70's era Soviet program experiences glory, loss, hope, and determination as she makes sacrifices for her country and tries to find light where none exists.

"Winterland is a tour de force that completely wrapped me up in its story. It follows the USSR's gold-winning 1970s & 80s gymnastics program through the eyes of Anya, a young girl selected to compete for the motherland at the precocious & tender age of eight. Anya cares nothing for winning gold for her country - she just wants to learn some new tricks - but over time, she will will grow to know the crucial role she plays in promoting Soviet pride & securing honor for her country ... but at what cost to her mental & physical health, as well as that of her teammates? The 1970s & 80s were a time when Soviet gymnasts dominated the world stage. The USSR was unstoppable, but behind the gold was a story of abuse & self-sacrifice. With real-life tales of horror such as that of Elena Mukhina, who was paralyzed at the hands of the USSR program & who is featured in this story, it is no surprise that Winterland is an absorbing, yet distressing look into Soviet gymnastics. Yet despite its dark & depressing overtones, Winterland is still a story of hope. Anya, the spirited little girl at the center of this novel, has heart & tries to be true to herself & those she loves despite her crushing circumstances."






Complete Guide to Sleep Care By Kiki Ely


The Magician's Nephew By C.S. Lewis


None of This Would Have Happened If Prince Were alive By Carolyn Prusa

Struggling to evacuate to Savannah as a Category Four hurricane bears down, Ramona, along with her entourage, navigates police check points, bathroom emergencies, demands from her boss, torrential downpours, and calls from her cheating ex, while wishing for the days when her life was like a Prince song. "Ramona Arnold has got it all ... except Prince. Which makes everything else going on in her life much worse, including Hurricane Matthew, a menacing Category 4 storm that is barreling towards Savannah & everything that Ramona holds dear. Throw in a good case of hurricane denial; a well-meaning but very anxious friend hounding her to get out of Dodge yesterday; & a pernicious check engine light in her van, & you've got the makings for some very palpable, cut-it-with-a-chainsaw angst. The issues Ramona experiences are enough to leave one frazzled if encountered solo at the best of times, but for her, they converge to form three harrowing, very no good days. In this book, Carolyn Prusa creates believable characters & excels at crafting tension in her debut novel. She sustains that tension throughout, leaving at least one storm-impacted reader exasperated: "Just leave, already." Who stops to play mini-golf mid-hurricane evacuation anyway? One remembers, though, that Ramona is doing her best. Or is she? Prince is gone, yes, but she's not. Nothing will be the same after Hurricane Matthew, & that just might not be so bad."






All That Is Mine I Carry With Me: A Novel




The Gospel of Orla by Eoghan Walls




Hang the Moon: A Novel by Jeannette Walls




Hello Beautiful: A Novel by Ann Napolitano




A House With Good Bones




The Secret Lives of Country Gentlemen by KJ Charles
