

IF YOU OR SOMEONE YOU KNOW IS HOMEBOUND We Can Help!



Here at LPPL we want to serve every member of our communities regardless of their ability to make their way to our locations. Part of our efforts to do this is making available our electronic, online services like cloudLibrary, Flipster, & Hoopla. Many people, however, still want a real, solid book or disc in their hands. If those people are ill, disabled, or otherwise prevented from leaving home to visit us for at least three months, we offer our Homebound Delivery Service. If you or someone you know is homebound, we can help! Keep reading to discover how.

Your LPPL offers free Homebound Delivery Services to Lafourche Parish residents who are physically unable to visit our library branches due to medical or mobility issues.

- Are you permanently or temporarily homebound for at least three months?
- Are you a resident of Lafourche Parish?
- Is your library card in good standing?

FOR SERVICES!

HOMEBOUND DELIVERY SERVICE GUIDELINES:

- Any LPPL cardholder who is either temporarily or permanently homebound for at least three months can register for Lafourche Parish Public Library's Homebound Delivery Services.
- All participants must have a library card in good standing.
- Participants must complete the Application for Homebound Services form, & mail, fax, email, or return it to their local LPPL branch. Participants can also call & have a library staff member complete their application over the phone.
- Participants can either arrange for a family member or friend to pick up their requested library materials or can arrange for home delivery of materials by the library, if needed.
- Items will be loaned for 21 days. Renewals will be allowed once for items that are not on hold for someone else. Participants can call their local branch to request that their items be renewed.

- Staff will generally select materials for participants by using the info supplied on the Homebound Services Application. Participants can also request specific items.
- Items not available at the time of request will be placed on hold. Participants will be notified when the item becomes available.
- Overdue fines are not charged for materials loaned under this service. However, because program participants are responsible for items checked out on their card, they will be charged the replacement cost for any & all materials that are lost and/or damaged while in their care. Library materials are considered lost when they are 90 days
- This service is only available for the homebound participant. Library materials should not be loaned to others.



No one wants to spend Valentine's Day with a book that's BORING which is why you should let NoveList Plus match you with a read you'll never forget this February. As a LPPL card holder, you have FREE access to the greatest reader's resource out there - NoveList Plus!

HOW IT WORKS:

- On the NoveList home page, click "Try Our Appeal Mixer."
- Select from which age group you would like a book match. (Adults, Teens, Kids)
- You can select up to three "appeal" categories to create your match.
 For example, for Adult books, appeal categories include: Character, Illustration, Pace, Storyline, Tone, & Writing Style.
- In the pull-down menus for the categories, select the appeals that you find appealing! There are so many to choose from! For example, in the Character Appeal category, you can pick from characters who are courageous, flawed, likeable, or quirky, to name a few!
- Once you create your perfect mix, click "Find Titles." You are now ready to browse your matches & find the book that is just right for you!
- Click each book title to learn more about the book. Clicking on "Check the Library Catalog" will search our catalog for you (Want to read something that we don't own? Place a request with us!)

Here's how to find your next great read in NoveList

1. Match your mood

Appeal helps you find books to match your mood -- whether that's witty, sassy, bleak, or something else. On the home screen, you'll find pre-selected I'm in the Mood For combos. Select the level (adult, teen, ages 9-12, or ages 0-8) and decide what mood you're in. If you don't like the suggested moods, click on the Appeal Mixer and create your own match.

2. Find a read-alike

If you just finished a book you loved, try this. Type the name of the title (or author or series) into the search bar at the top. On the right side of the page are librarian-created **Read-alike** suggestions. If those aren't enough, head to the bottom of the page and use **Search for More** to find what you love.

3. Browse your favorite genres

Whether you haven't read a mystery in fifteen years or are looking for a new series, Genre Browse will show you what's new in a genre, as well as suggestions for popular subgenres. Look for it in the top menu under **Browse By... Genre**.



4. Need a recommendation?

On the left side of the homepage the **Recommended Reads** lists in both fiction and nonfiction, for all ages, are a great place to start.

5. Just-right books

If you're looking for a specific reading level, go the **Advanced Search** page where you'll be able to search for books based on grade, Lexile score, or Accelerated Reader level. After you search, narrow the results down using the other subject and appeal limiters on the left.

6. Don't forget the audiobooks

A narrator's voice matters, and you can search for specific audio styles (in NoveList Plus only). Get started by clicking on the **Browse By... Audiobooks** menu at the top.

Book Rewiews

"If You Go to New Orleans, You Oughta Go See The Mardi Gras"



New Orleans: the birthplace of jazz, Creole cuisine, and Mardi Gras madness. From the food, to the inhabitants, the city of New Orleans is truly a gumbo. There's no other city in the world quite like New Orleans. Its architecture is a unique blend of 18th and 19th century French and Spanish architecture, with a lazy island atmosphere. In Sharon Keating's new book, New Orleans Then and Now, it's easy to see why New Orleans is one of the most photographed cities in the world.

In <u>New Orleans Then and Now</u>, Sharon Keating demonstrates both the former and present beauty of New Orleans. Much like a picture book for adults, the book documents what various sites in the city used to look like, versus what it looks like today. Keating also gives a short, detailed history of each site, demonstrating the rich history of the city, as well as how each building has changed over time. The book features must see tourist sites, such as the French Market, St. Charles Avenue, and Lafitte's Blacksmith Shop. It also features lesser-known sites such as the first "skyscraper", the southern railway station, and the Michel Pitot House.

This was a great book to read for short histories on the city. My favorite part, aside from the beautiful pictures, was Keating's excerpts on each photo. As both a lover of history and the city of New Orleans, I was fascinated how the city has changed over the centuries. Keating perfectly captures how the city has changed and modernized, yet has held on to its old world charm.

This is a fascinating, although quick read for both tourists and locals of New Orleans.




THE FRENCH GIRL by Lexie Elliott (Berkley)


SUMMER HOURS AT THE ROBBERS LIBRARY


