Infusing the romance of the Christmas season with the humor of Groundhog Day and a dash of Bridget Jones's hopelessness, Kelk delivers an utterly adorable rom-com.

"I wish it could be Christmas every day ... or not? Lindsey Kelk is here with a delightfully humorous holiday read! Surprisingly enough, despite being amusing, this novel, in which a 30-something woman relives a cringe-worthy Christmas Day over & over again, is also incredibly insightful. After a disastrous Christmas Day, Gwen Baker, newly single by way of a cheating boyfriend & unsure about her career future at her prestigious law firm, wakes up to discover it is Christmas Day ... over & over again. How many times can Gwen relive all of her Christmas nightmares before she gets it right? Kelk masterfully mixes humor & heart in The Christmas Wish! When you throw family together at the holidays, tensions are bound to run high, & Kelk perfectly captures all of these merry mishaps in her book. Main character Gwen is witty, funny, & slightly self-destructive, & it's a lot of fun watching her live Christmas Day on repeat, getting it drastically wrong every time. As she searches for her truth in each Christmas scenario, Gwen discovers what she truly wants out of life, making this introspective novel a great transition read to go from the joys of Christmas to the fresh starts of the New Year.



A decade-by-decade cookbook that highlights the best (and a few of the worst) baking recipes from the 20th century.


"Eggs, moo juice, & floof powder, oh my! TikTok star B. Dylan Hollis is the baking wizard taking us back with recipes of the past in his cookbook Baking Yesteryear. Hollis has built his platform by recreating recipes from old cookbooks throughout the decades. His cookbook combines recipes from as early as the 1900s & continuing each decade ending in the 1980s. The book begins with Dylan's story, baking terms needed to complete the recipes in the book, as well as utensils & different types of ingredients needed for the recipes. Each chapter features some of his favorite recipes from each decade, & even includes a section on the worst recipes he has tried, including jellied meatloaf! All of the recipes feature simple ingredients & detailed, but easy-to-understand directions. Some of them are more classic, while others are out there & include some non-typical ingredients. Overall, this cookbook would be great for anyone from the experienced baker to those just learning. It's also great for someone like me who is a follower of Dylan's & has seen him prepare some of these recipes. Now his followers can try to make them too. I'm not sure if I'll be making pork cake anytime soon, but I sure will be trying to create some of these unique recipes of the past!"

Damian Losa requires Rapp to infiltrate what appears to be a Syrian government drug operation. As Rapp fights his way through the bad guys, he realizes that everything they thought that they knew was wrong. Now it's up to Rapp to take down the enemy alone. READ THIS BOOK! This was another riveting tale in the saga that is Mitch Rapp's life. Mills' use of asymmetrical warfare was enlightening. It gave me a whole new way of thinking about the world. 


a Dead and Stormy Night By Steffanie Holmes

"A Dead & Stormy Night by Steffanie Holmes is the first book in the Nevermore Bookshop Mysteries series. After being passed over for her fashion dream job in New York City & finding out that she has a degenerative eye disease that will cause her to go blind, Mina Wilde returns to the sleepy village in England where she grew up. There, she takes a job at the Nevermore Bookshop, where she figures she can heal surrounded by her favorite books. However, the Nevermore Bookshop isn't what it seems. There's a curse on the bookshop that brings classic literature characters to life. If that wasn't strange enough, Mina's ex-best-friend ends up dead on the eaves of Nevermore Bookshop with a knife sticking out of her back. With Mina as the chief suspect, she & the shop proprietor work together to solve the murder & clear her name. I thoroughly enjoyed this audiobook. This was my first dip into the cozy mystery genre. It's every bookworm's dream to have their book boyfriends come to life, & this book does not disappoint. Along with the murder mystery, there's a little bit of spicy romance. This is a fun book, despite the main character suffering with the loss of her eyesight & murder of her ex-best friend. Holmes expertly blends the cozy murder mystery genre with fantasy romance. 
"The Silver Chair, along with the rest of the Narnia series, is set to be a Netflix series. Lewis took a chance with The Silver Chair because he dropped the Pevensie children from this story, who were heavily featured in previous books. He concentrates on Eustace (a relation to the Pevensies) & his schoolmate Jill Pole in this novel. They begin their story in Experiment House, a school that does not encourage imagination or creativity. One day, while being chased by bullies, they are transported back to Narnia. This novel definitely has the most action out of all of the Narnia books & indeed it never lets up. The Green Witch is an enemy to match the White Witch from earlier novels & is every bit as beautiful & evil. The Marchwiggle, the children's companion is a good foil for these characters & is comical in his own way. The two children are likable by novel's end, being both heroic & willing to sacrifice. The author's passages are clear & descriptive with enough whimsy to remind the reader this is a children's fantasy dealing with a few adult themes."

The Librarianist By Patrick delbitt


Tells the story of Bob Comet, a man who has lived his life through and for literature, unaware that his own experience is a poignant and affecting novel in itself.

"Bob Comet's is a life & was a career punctuated by routine. Bob's lifelong love of books resulted in a more than four decades-long stay at the library, with early mornings there - when it was devoid of people - his favorite part of the day. With a few bright spots along the way, Bob finds himself an aging, solitary man. During a routine walk, a chance encounter at a convenience store causes Bob to crash headlong into his past, though he doesn't realize it yet. Bob walks 'Chip' back to the assisted living center displayed on her name tag. It's the first step in allowing others back in, as he becomes closer to the center's residents, & ultimately, in reconciling his past. In *The Librarianist*, Patrick deWitt offers a tale of an ordinary man on the outside trying to reconnect. As a comet is brightest when it nears the sun, Bob Comet's light shines the greatest when his life includes & revolves around others. *The Librarianist* is a beautifully written story that will resonate with readers who will find themselves captivated by Bob's story. It's a story not unlike those in the books Bob cherished throughout his life - a story of love & friendship, of loss, & of starting over."

In this worthy prequel to *Legends & Lattes*, a young Viv is laid up in the quiet town of Murk after her enthusiastic inexperience leads to a serious injury. She gradually assembles a group of friends including a swear-happy bookshop owner, a mercenary turned baker, and an irrepressible Gallina, eager to join Rackham's Raiders. Murk doesn't stay quiet for long with Viv around, and there's plenty of coziness in the bookshop, eating delicious baked goods, and flirting with a new friend.

A Grandmother Begins the Story: A Novel Michelle Porter (Algonquin)






The Other Half Charlotte Vassell (Anchor Books)
