"Not too many people remember Spiro T. Agnew. In Bag Man, authors Rachel Maddow & Michael Yarvitz revisit Agnew's time as Vice President of the United States, a brash & brazen criminal who was literally days away from inheriting the role of the President of the United States. In *Bag Man,* Maddow & Yarvitz chronicle the race to get Agnew out of the White House before whatever fate would befall the beleaguered President Richard Nixon would occur & before Agnew would become the highest leader in the land. The backstory: The Watergate investigation was in full force, & Nixon was in scalding hot water. For decades, the crimes of Spiro T. Agnew were overshadowed by those of Nixon. Bag Man brings those crimes to light, & in the process, brings to the forefront the work of those who brought him down & likely, saved the United States from another constitutional crisis. For those readers who TRUE CRIMES appreciate political history, it's a good read."

There's no other city quite like New Orleans, full of dark mystery & intrigue. It's no surprise that Melissa Marr chose our great city as the backdrop for her newest adult urban fantasy series, *Faery Bargains*. I absolutely loved the first installment titled *The Wicked & the Dead*. Genevieve Crowe, a Jewish Wiccan woman, beheads the dead in a near-future New Orleans. When her magic goes sideways, the only person strong enough to help her is Eli Stonecroft, a faery who chose to be a bar-owner in New Orleans over a life in Elphame. Main character Genevieve Crowe is fascinating. She's a witch of mixed supernatural heritage with an affinity for the dead. Plus, she's one kick-butt heroine. Although she portrays herself as hard & unfeeling, there's a certain charming vulnerability to her once she opens up to her friend Eli. The story was compelling & fresh, as well. Prior to Faery Bargains: LAURELL K. HAMILTON Book 1: The Wicked & the Dead, I had not encountered such creatures as the Scandinavian draugn. Ray Bradbury has been called one of the greatest science fiction/fantasy/horror writers of the past century. He is best known for his collections of short stories & *The* Illustrated Man is one of his all-time masterpieces. The novel consists of eighteen stories & won the International Fantasy Award in 1952. 'These imaginative science fiction stories range from the not-so-ordinary world of middle America to the vast reaches of outer space as they explore themes of love, madness, & death.' Bradbury's writing style is easy to follow & his story ideas are indeed creative & original. Because of the length of the stories, the author moves the action forward quickly. Many of the stories contain endings that will surprise & sometimes shock the reader. Bradbury's themes are still as relevant today as they were 70 years ago.



The Photographer is about her obsession with one particular family & how she infiltrates their lives. From the very first page of this unsettling novel, I was hooked on Carter's writing style & tone, & soon realized that this wasn't the same worn out suspense plot that has been recycled over & over again throughout the years in this genre.
