

#### The Eden Jest By Udam Sternbergh

A couple are forced to the ultimate extremes to save their marriage - and themselves - over the course of a week-long couples retreat.

"The Eden Test. A set of seven questions asked over the course of a week to test the strength of a relationship. Daisy has signed her marriage up for the test. She & her husband Craig will spend a week in a cabin in upstate New York testing the limits of their relationship. But what they discover will end up changing their lives forever because both are keeping secrets from each other. Will they come out stronger on the other side of the Eden Test or is their marriage destined to die? Adam Sternbergh's The Eden Test is a book that I did not see coming. This literary fiction-suspense cross completely blindsided me in a good way, mashing up everything that I love about both genres into one utterly captivating read. Sternbergh has a talented gift for working twists & turns into the folds of his story, integrating them in such a way that they just work naturally with the flow of his novel. I rarely literally feel compelled to keep turning the pages when reading a book, but The Eden Test surely pushed my self-control to the limit. I suspected nothing going into this book, so I won't say more beyond if you enjoy well-crafted, intricately plotted novels with twists that slowly sneak up on you, pick up The Eden Test."



#### When Things Aren't Going Right, Go Left By Marc Colagiovanni


From Peter H. Reynolds and talented debut author Marc Colagiovanni comes an inspirational story about optimism, overcoming adversity, & forging your own path.

The rest of his day leaves him dealing with his worries, doubts, fears, & frustrations, but he chooses to leave all of those negative feelings behind & continue to go left. Even though this picture book is aimed for children, it is a great reminder for all ages that we do have a choice when it comes to our feelings & emotions, even though sometimes it seems as if we don't. The vibrant illustrations by Peter H. Reynolds will draw you in, but the easy-to-read words & message will leave you wanting more & may inspire you to go left."



#### The Stolen Heir By Holly Black


Hiding in the human world, Suren, the tormented child queen of the Court of Teeth, must guard her heart against a manipulative prince whom she cannot trust when she agrees to join him on a quest.

"Holly Black's newest book, The Stolen Heir, is the first book in a new duology series. The Stolen Heir is filled with court intrigue, mystery, betrayal, & longing. Eight years have passed since the events of The Folk of the Air's final book, The Queen of Nothing. Most of the courts of Elfhame have sworn fealty to Jude & Cardan, but the Lady Nore of the Court of Teeth has reclaimed the Ice Needle Citadel, where she exacts her revenge against the queen & king of Elfhame. Suren, her daughter & rightful queen of the Court of Teeth, is on the run in the human world. When Suren is rescued from a storm hag by the Prince of Elfhame, he asks her to join him on a quest to the Ice Needle Citadel. Suren must face her growing feelings for the prince, as well as her fears of returning to the horrors she faced in the Court of Teeth. I was ecstatic to be given the chance to return to the world of Elfhame, & The Stolen Heir did not disappoint. There are several twists & turns, true to Holly Black's eloquent style of writing. While this book does feature characters from The Folk of the Air series, you can use this book as your starting point into the foray of Holly Black's world of faerie.'




# The Nightmare Man By J.H. Markert

A chilling horror novel illustrates the fine line between humanity and monstrosity.


"J.H. Markert has written an excellent first book. The Nightmare Man begins at Blackwood mansion, a dark, brooding home located on top of a hill near the town of New Haven. Ben Bookman, a horror writer, had grown up in the house & decides to return to gain inspiration for his newest horror novel. Detective Mills & his daughter are soon called to investigate a horrendous murder where a family is killed & placed in stitched cocoons made of corn husks. This murder mirrors the murder from one of Ben's books, & then a second incident happens also mirroring one of the author's plots. Ben must investigate what is happening by opening up the dark history of Blackwood that will not be soon forgotten. This novel will definitely keep the reader absorbed throughout. However, it does have some problems - a lot of ideas are presented all at once & it does get a little confusing. Also, the novel has a number of flashbacks that detract from the original narrative. I also found the ending to be a little rushed & disappointing. Despite these issues, Markert does a commendable job for his first work - the characters are interesting & the story is fast-paced & terrifying. I am anxious to see Markert's next work."




#### Community Board By Jara Conklin

A woman moves back into her parents' empty home after her husband leaves her and spends her days on the town's internet community board.


"Darcy Clipper thought life was fine. Then one day her husband abruptly ends their marriage, & the contented life that Darcy knew is gone. After her boss suggests a sabbatical, she makes her way to her childhood home in Murbridge. Holed up in her childhood home, Darcy avoids face-to-face interaction with others & delves deep into the town's online community board. When did people begin to suck,' she wonders. As time passes, Darcy is forced to interact, & it is here that her transformation begins. In Community Board, Tara Conklin not only gives us a glimpse into the life of a seemingly broken woman who must rebuild her new normal, but also that of a cast of characters known only anonymously & online at first. As a crisis develops in this case, a public playground for kids in the works & funded by & located on the property of two gay dads the town must grapple with its identity. Community Board is at times, funny; at times, moving; & at times, everything in between. It is also a refreshing take on government by the people & for the people, & provides a bit of hope that said people just might not be as bad as they seem."






