Materials:

- One small clean pizza box box per person
- An open space
- Music (optional)



Directions:

1. Everyone gets their own pizza box.

2. Everyone walks around the room balancing the pizza box on their head.

3. If the box falls off the person who was balancing that box must freeze.

4. He or she can only be unfrozen when ANOTHER person retrieves the pizza box (without dropping their own) and places it on the frozen person's head. If the helper's pizza box falls off then that person also must freeze until someone else helps.

5. The game ends when everyone is frozen or everyone is unfrozen.

*Variation: If you don't have enough pizza boxes, take turns OR balance something else like bean bags, rubber ducks, or small stuffed animals.

RUT PIZZA RECIP



Ingredients:

Slice of Bread (We used cinnamon raisin bread!) ¹/₂ Cup Plain Greek Yogurt* 1 Teaspoon of Honey

1/2 Teaspoon of Vanilla Extract

¹/₂ cup of fruit (Suggestions: grapes, blueberries, grapes, peaches) 1 tablespoon Shredded Coconut

*Note: You can also use flavored yogurt. If you do, don't add the honey or vanilla.

Directions:

Make the "sauce"

1. Mix together the yogurt, honey, and vanilla

Make the "dough"

1. Cut the bread into a circular shape with a cookie cutter or a glass

Assemble your pizza


- 2. Put a layer of yogurt sauce on the bread
- 3. Place the fruit on top.


Add the "cheese"

4. Sprinkle on the shredded coconut.



I can't wait to see what you decide the problem is and how you get the characters to solve it!



You can use the audio book from our story as your puppet's voice and then move your puppet around in the same way you would if the puppet actually were speaking.


You could instead write your own story and then you could be the puppet's voice and make it move around as if it were actually speaking.
